Reverend Michael writes:

Isaiah 43:19 See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?



Whenever a priest moves to a new parish it is a significant new beginning in their lives and ministry. It almost always involves a new role and a new home and living in a new community. These can be challenging and stressful (particularly if one has been in a previous parish for many years) but I have been reflecting over the past few weeks about the extra new beginnings that I have embarked on alongside my new role as associate rector here.
